Our Guild will celebrate its 17th birthday on January 17th, at Colma Town Hall, from



Adding to the Guild's display of old fire department photos was a fine selection of vintage items out of the Wembley Station fire museum, including a dandy brass lantern (*used as a headlamp in the* old days), a model fire engine, maps and photos brought by the Chief.

Bob expertly drew the history of the department from volunteer days and hand-drawn fire equipment to the most-encouraging forecasts of para-medic expertise on all the stations.

An auction of vintage Daly City street signs was offered to the attendees, which resulted in the sale of four signs. Auctioneers Mark Weinberger and Al Teglia sold John Daly to Treasurer Russ Brabec, Gellert to DC Councilwoman Carol Klatt, Sweetwood to Jean Gallagher, and Hillside to the ubiquitous Mike Rocchetta of the Hillside Homeowners Assn.

The following street signs are still available for purchase: Abbott, Alemany, Bayshore, Bellevue (with Sullivan on reverse side), Creston, Crocker, Dennis, Eastmoor, Geneva, Gilman with Oliver, Knowles, Lycett, Pierce, Templeton and Westdale.

Signs are offered for **\$25.01** each, as we suspend the auction until next November. If they aren't sold out, the price leaps to **\$25.02**. Delivery is not included, but coffee would be served at the **Gillespie** home upon pickups.

By the way, member and Colma mayor **Dennis Fisicaro** didn't bid on the *Dennis* sign, in spite of audience urging. In later conversaation with him he indicated that Colma signs wouldn't be too intriguing, *A St.*, *B St.*, etc.

While physically unable to attend only a very few of our meetings, she was a member whose little notes of encouragement were always upbeat and positive. She taught English and Journalism at Jefferson High School from 1926 to 1945.

A long-time resident of Colma, Assunta "Susie" Olcese, passed away on Nov. 19, at the age of 98. "Susie" was the mother of Guild members John Olcese and Elsie Schenone. In her memory the Guild received a contribution given jointly by additional members of her family, Marilyn Olcese, Joyce Olcese, Tillio Olcese Jr., and Alan Olcese.
