



"Top-of-the-Hill" Author Is March Guild Speaker

A member of the Guild, along with his wife, Audrey, Bernard's home-published description of his life and adventures while growing up in Daly City during the l920s and 1930s, is a valuable addition for any local history collection of books and information. The 127page volume is heavily laced with vintage photos of the old days, some of which he will show in slide form as an adjunct to his oral presentation. Mr. Winn will bring along copies of his book to sell.
