
The program will be an update of facilities available at the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) in San Bruno,. presented by Lisa Miller, Senior Archivist at the local Federal Government repository.

Lisa holds degrees in American Studies from University of Minnesota, and presents a charming program entitled WHAT'S IN IT FOR YOU? She has archival experience nationwide, and will bring us up-to-date on methodology.

Many of us are already using the facilities of the National Archives and Records Administration. There ARE opportunities to volunteer to work with the historical records down in San Bruno. Lisa will tell you how.

It has been ten years since we last heard from a representative of NARA, and much more information has been plugged into the collection. More than 50,000 cubic feet of original records generated by Federal courts and agency field offices are available for inspection. Of special interest are the genealogical documents, whereby visitors can ascertain family tree information in a pleasant atmosphere, with helpful assistants.
