
#### Aerial Views of DC/ Colma in Library Now

The upstairs display case at Serramonte Library has a new feature: some thirty aerial photographs showing the development of the North County, from the days of dunes and cabbage patches to the almost-filled geography of Daly City and Colma. Intriguing details, such as freight trains rumbling North into San Francisco, can be seen, from the perspective of birds in flight or visitors to the top of San Bruno Mountain.

# "The Hole In the Doughnut" Topic for March Meeting

Those of you that have been around and watched the development of the North County since the late '40s (or earlier) might recall when **Broadmoor Village** was affectionately known by the above appellation. No derogation of the area was ever intended. The phrase simply referred to the location of the Village, as it sprawled on the gentle hillsides West of Junipero Serra Blvd., becoming more and more surrounded by Daly City.

The History of Broadmoor Village is the topic for the Wednesday, March 20, 7:30 p.m., meeting of the History Guild when member Marie Brizuela will be the featured speaker. Marie, and her husband Robert, have been residents of Broadmoor since 1964, and have seen the area develop from



near-barren hillsides into beautiful tree-laden slopes. **Marie** will share her vast knowledge of Broadmoor history, as only a person strongly involved over the years can do. She is an undeniable fount of information.

The speaker has long been active with the Broadmoor Property Owners Assn. and Garden Village PTA. She was president of BPOA for two years, initiated their annual Installation Dinner, served as Grapevine Newsletter editor, King & Queen Contest chairperson, and added her valuable input to many other community committees.

Marie, a 20-year member of the Jefferson Elementary School District board of trustees, was for13 years the proprietor of the North Peninsula Dance Academy. She is a retired secretary of the DC Fire Dept., past president of Westlake Catholic Women, the DC Friends of the Library, Mission Merchants, and DC Civic Ballet.

The evening promises to be highly informative and a rare opportunity to learn more about our near and dear neighbor, **Broadmoor Village.** Those with pertinent memorabilia are invited to bring items along to display before, during and after the program.


