
Vintage Top-of-the-Hill BW Home Movies For March 19 Meeting

Ever wonder what Daly City's businesssection at the Top-of-the-Hill looked like in the Good Old Days? Thanks to the original Lions Club of Daly City, the Guild's collection of archival treasures includes footage taken by the Daly City Record's chief photographer, Dale Hovey, back in 1941. Things looked a lot different then. Mr. Hovey took his movie camera along Mission Street, up Wellington Avenue, into Smith's Lumber Yard on Hillside, to the office of Mayor John Fahey, etc. The film is a true "walk back in time" experience.

Thanks to friend-of-the-Guild **Bill Verducci**, **Hovey's** vintage film reels were translated into video tape for the Guild in 1999.

Thanks to **Mike Stallings** and the <u>DC Parks</u> <u>& Recreation Dept.</u>, the Guild is now able to share historical videos at our membership meetings at the Doelger Center's multi-use room, utilizing equipment maintained by <u>DCP&R</u>. Such usage debuted last November when <u>DC Sports Hall of</u> <u>Fame</u> video was shown. That was a 15-minute experiment. It proved successful.

The 1941 Lions' video shows "Charter Members at Work" in 34 locations around the Daly City business sector, ranging from McGraw's Drug store to Dr. Budaeff's office to Bill Sweeney's gas station and car lot, two Banks of America, the flower shop at Olivet, Garden Village being constructed, Belli Motor Co., Vireno's Market, the Colonial Café, the Villa Sanitarium, etc etc.



We plan to show *half* of the footage, which runs about 35 minutes. During the "silents", attendees will be encouraged to provide input as to locations, personalities, identifications, and whatever. The other half will be saved for another History Evening.

Lions Club members are encouraged to wear their organizational vests and/or other Lions' regalia to the program on Wednesday, March 19, 7:30 p.m., at Doelger Center.
