

Notes From Here And There

Lincoln Park Community Center, 901
Brunswick St. in the Crocker Tract, has been updated and given a new look. Dedication of the facility was Aug. 23. In another lifetime, we remember the area as "the new playground at Acton and Brunswick streets." Later it was called Acton Park, and eventually Lincoln Park. Use as a playground dates from the late 1930s.

John Donald Daly was remembered fondly when Colma Historical Association hosted a walk thru Woodlawn Cemetery as a preevent EVENT in prelude to Victorian Day.

Robert S. Thornton is to be honored with the installation of six historical and informational panels to be placed in the near (hopefully) future at a coastal overview of Thornton Beach and the Pacific Ocean. Watch for development of a designated parking and walking area at the west end of John Daly Boulevard. It's a Parks & Recreation Dept. project.

Sadly, we must report the passing of Evelyn Smith, the widow of Hugh H. Smith Jr., one of the Guild's long-time members. Hugh was a DC Councilman until called to the service during WWII. His father, "HH", was DC Mayor from 1918-1936.
