SETON MEDICAL CENTER SPEAKER FOR MAY 18

Daly City's MVMML (Most Visible Man-Made Landmark), Seton Medical Center, will be the topic for the Wednesday, May 18, 7:30p.m. meeting of the History Guild of Daly City/Colma in the Community Room at Doelger Center, 110 Lake Merced Blvd., DC.

Arranged by Vice-President Richard Rocchetta, the program will recognize Seton's 40th year in Daly City. Speaker will be LeeRoy Eyheralde, Clinical Nurse Educator, who will outline the history of the institution that moved to DC in 1965. Mr. Eyheralde began his career with Mary's Help Hospital in 1961, Seton's former name, when the facility was located in SF's Mission District.

Twice before, the hospital was the topic for Guild-sponsored meetings. In January of 1983, a history of the hospital was given by **Sister M. Florence** and **Jeremiah Guerini** at Serramonte Library.

In September of 1991, Sister Florence Urbine and Ms. Marie Mahoney presented personal "Reflections on MHH and SMC".

THORNTON BEACH VISTA DEDICATED

Now officially opened for the enjoyment of any and all is Daly City's new **Thornton Beach Vista**, named to honor the memory of **Robert Sheldon Thornton**, the first person to settle on land now known as Daly City and Colma.

An uprooted Rhode Islander,

Thornton rode his horse south from the Cliff House and obviously liked what he saw as he camped in sand dunes just South of what is now Olympic Golf Club property. That was in 1853. The terrain, while beautiful, was inhabited only by wildlife and sparse vegetation. Thornton put down roots; established a blacksmith and other businesses; brought his wife, Sarah, west to join him; started a family as well as a nucleus of population; dabbled in politics; started the Jefferson School District, and eventually had a school named in his honor,

The Vista, located at the west end of John Daly Blvd., is a beautiful spot.

March Meeting Fun, Even for Speaker!

Tom McGraw, CEO of First National Bank of Northern California since 2002, was the guest speaker for March 16 meeting of the History Guild.

Personable and informative, Mr. McGraw discussed the establishment of the bank, and his family background, rooted in South San Francisco and the Top-of-the-Hill McGraw's Drugstore, dating from 1928. His first job there, he confided, was scraping chewing from entrance-way sidewalks.

Preceding his talk, and as a surprise for Mr. McGraw and attendees, rare vintage silent film footage showed the McGraw Brothers at work in the store in 1941. Richard Rocchetta, HG vice-president/ program chair, introduced the speaker. At the end of the program, President Mark presented the Guild's Certificate of Appreciation to Mr. McGraw.
