This presentation of local history is a condensed version of Gillespie's "Picture Our Past" slide-and-speak program created in 1986 for a black-tie dinner at Lake Merced Golf Club. That event celebrated Daly City's 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of incorporation.

The January afternoon gathering will allow ample time for friendly visitations and chit-chat among attendees. It is suggested that those who own History Guild Membership Badges proclaiming their name wear them to the party, as was the norm when the Guild was launched. Reminiscences of her grandfather, Ricco Lagomarsino, continued the Guild's tradition of hosting histories of local families when Lisa Angelot spoke at the Nov. 16 History Evening in Doelger Center's multi-use room.

Introduced by vice-president and program chair, Richard Rocchetta, the speaker traced her family history from earliest days through Mr. Lagomarsino's role as one of the founders of the First National Bank of Daly City, now First National Bank of Northern California. Ms. Angelot carries on Lagomarsino Family involvement with FNB as she serves on the current board of directors.

With his brother William, aka Willie, Ricco Lagomarsino was instrumental in development of homes and apartments on the east side of Junipero Serra Blvd. after WWII.

Attendees were also given the opportunity to view a wall-mounted display of vintage building plans and enjoy power-point photographic images of the family through the years. On conclusion of the program, president Mark Weinberger presented the Guild's traditional "Certificate of Appreciation".

# Trader Joe's Unique DC History Gallery


