


### DALY CITY'S FILIPINO HISTORY MARCH PROGRAM

Perla Ibarrientos is President of the Philipino Bayanihan Resource Center, Vice-President of the North Peninsula Food Pantry Dining Center, and a member of the Personnel Commission of Daly City. She has received the Citizen of the Year Award from Daly City and was the State of California Legislator Woman of the Year in 1997. Erlinda Galeon is President of the Philippine Association of University Women-USA. President of CORA Kumares/Kumpares and a member of the Daly City Library Board of Trustees. Erlinda has received the Presidential Award (for CORA Outreach Program) from Phillipine President Gloria Arroyo and was named "Peninsula Angel" by the San Francisco Examiner. ## Centennial Countdown

Happy Birthday, Daly City! In March of 1908, just one hundred years before this month, you did not exist. You might have been a "glimmer" in some person's mind, but residents of the area had not yet made known their official feelings on the matter of incorporating as a city of San Mateo County.

Dedication to starting a city was indicated on March 18, 1911, when 274 men cast ballots for incorporation. (Women, of course, could not experience the privilege of voting at that time.) The vote was 138 to 136.

County supervisors, when canvassed four days later on March 22, were unanimous in their support of the resolution voted by north

county residents. Thus the deed was accomplished. According to the front page of the *Colma Record* newspaper of March 24, 1911, there was "naught by joy at the result."

The election had been hard fought. The *Record* reported: "Good men and true were opposed to the issue, and their honesty cannot be questioned. For the most part, they are public-spirited men and naturally inclined toward progressiveness, but through personal misunderstandings and misrepre- sentations they were led to oppose the project at the polls. Such men always make 'good losers'." The *Record* had "confidence that they (anti-incorporation people) will come forward with feelings of true patriotism and determination to give incorporation a fair trial."

Thus you were born. Happy Birthday, again. We love you. K/BG.

In March, 2011, Daly City will reach the admirable age of 100. The History Guild has set a target date of approximately 36 months to transform the interior of the former John Daly Library building into a loving and lasting showcase for Daly City history as our Centennial gift to the people of Daly City. All kinds of help is needed, brawn as well as brains and bucks. Your consideration, as always, is appreciated.
